<b>Facility:</b>	Keating Natatorium is an 8 lane x 50 meter indoor pool with a removable bulkhead in place to make 2 25 yard competition pools, and Colorado timing system with Scoreboard display. The water depth is 6ft from the balcony (south) end of the pool to 4ft in depth at the Scoreboard (north) end of the pool The host will ensure the required course dimensions.

<b>Meet Type:</b>	Invitational Meet. NO entry time standard. Prelim/Final: 11&Older, 2 heats (14 swimmers) in Finals: 11-12, 13-14, 15&Older Timed Final: 10&Under
<b># of Sessions:</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• 10 Sessions over 4 days, 1 pool per session.</li> <li>• In the event of heavy entries, health conditions permitting, we may swim chase starts (even/odd start ends with chase starts) with the help of volunteer timers from visiting teams to cover one end.</li> </ul> <p>Please visit the event page on <a href="http://cincy-marlins.com">cincy-marlins.com</a> for updated information before the meet.</p>
<b>Medical Supervision available to athletes</b>	Keating Natatorium has 2 automated external defibrillators (AED's) located at each end of the pool. Certified and trained Lifeguards are also on deck during all warmups and competition sessions.

Organization Regulations/Waivers	
<b>USA Swimming Rules</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• At a sanctioned competitive event, all USA Swimming athletes must be under the supervision of a USA Swimming member coach. Arrangements for coach supervision must be made in advance of the meet.</li> <li>• Any swimmer entered in the meet <u>must</u> be certified by a USA Swimming member-coach as being proficient in performing a racing start or must start each race from within the water without the use of the backstroke ledge. When unaccompanied by a member-coach, it is the responsibility of the swimmer or the swimmer's legal guardian to ensure compliance with this requirement.</li> <li>• The use of audio or visual recording devices, including a cell phone, is not permitted in changing areas, rest rooms or locker rooms.</li> <li>• Use of cameras, cell phones or any other recording device is not permitted immediately behind the starting blocks at either end of the racing course(s) during race starts, competition and warm-ups. Please refer to the Safe Sport section of the Ohio Swimming, Inc. policies and procedures for further information regarding the use of visual recording devices.</li> <li>• Deck changes are prohibited.</li> <li>• Operation of a drone, or any other flying apparatus, is prohibited over the venue (pools, athlete/coach areas, spectator areas and open ceiling locker rooms) any time athletes, coaches, officials and/or spectators are present.</li> <li>• Flash photography is not permitted at the start of any race.</li> <li>• All applicable adults participating in or associated with this meet acknowledge that they are subject to the provisions of the USA Swimming Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policy (MAAPP) and that they understand that compliance with the MAAPP policy is a condition of participation in the conduct of this competition.</li> </ul>
<b>Technical Suit Ban</b>	<p>Per USA Swimming Rule 102.8.1F, 12 &amp; Under athletes may not compete in Technical Suits at this meet.</p> <p>A Technical Suit is one that has the following components:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Any male or female suit with bonded or taped seams regardless of fabric or silhouette; or</li> <li>• Any male or female suit with woven fabric extending to the knee or mid-thigh regardless of the seam type.</li> </ul>
<b>Ohio State Laws that are applicable to Ohio Swimming sanctioned events</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Ohio's Return to Play Law (ORC 3313.539 and ORC 3314.03) requires that coaches and referees either (1) complete a free online training once every three (3) years in recognizing the symptoms of concussion or (2) hold a pupil-activity program permit from the Ohio State Board of Education. Free online concussion training is offered through the National Federation of State High School Association and Centers of Disease Control. Training links can be found at <a href="http://www.swimohio.com">www.swimohio.com</a> under Safe Sport&gt;Concussion.</li> <li>• There will be the required number of certified lifeguard(s) on duty at all times at this meet per Ohio Administrative Code 3701-31-04-E-4.</li> </ul>
<b>Safe Sport 360</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• The U.S. Center for Safe Sport program is a comprehensive abuse prevention program dedicated to creating a healthy and positive environment free from abuse for all its members. Components of the program include, but are not limited to, providing education and training, enforcing policies (such as the Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policy), rules and best practice guidelines, promoting healthy boundaries and mandatory reporting of violations.</li> <li>• The Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policy (MAAPP) prohibits Applicable Adults (as defined) from having one-on-one interactions with minor athletes which are not within an observable and interruptible distance from another adult. Times achieved by an athlete who turns age 18 on or after the first day of competition, who competes in this USA Swimming sanctioned event without completing this membership requirement, will NOT count for qualification or recognition. <p><b>Waiver/Release</b></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• By entering this meet, you are granting permission for the names of any or all of your team's swimmers to be published on the internet in the form of Psych Sheets, Meet Results, or any other documents associated with the running of this meet.</li> <li>• All participants agree to be filmed and photographed by the host club approved photographer(s) and videographers and to allow the right to use names and pictures before, during, or after the meet such as in public psych sheets, heat sheets, and results or featured on the host club or OSI website or social media or in public broadcast of the event via television or webcast. Parents and guardians of minor swimmers who do not wish their swimmers to participate in interviews or have individual pictures featured on any media should inform their team's head coach and the Meet Director prior to the meet.</li> </ul>
<p><b>Code of Conduct</b></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Any individual who exhibits a behavior of a threatening, abusive, or derogatory manner toward an official or member of the meet staff is subject to immediate removal and further expulsion from the meet. Coaches will be notified of the actions of their respective teams.</li> <li>• Good sportsmanship is expected at all times. Bullying or taunting, foul language or derogatory behavior will not be tolerated and will be subject to immediate removal. All volunteers, spectators, coaches, officials and meet staff are expected to be respectful of others.</li> <li>• The Ohio Swimming Code of Conduct governs this meet. The purpose of the Zero-Tolerance Code of Conduct Policy is to establish consistent expectations across the LSC in the best interest of our Athletes and Sport. Ohio Swimming is committed to creating a safe and fair environment for all of its athlete members. This policy is to be used as a guide to promote a positive environment and good sportsmanship at meets and events conducted in the geographical boundary of Ohio Swimming. <b>Eligibility:</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>All meet contestants must be a member in good standing per Article 302.</li> <li>All contestants must be verified USA Swimming members. Membership will not be verified at the meet.</li> <li>Membership verification deadline is 5 PM EST one (1) business day prior to the first day of the meet. Unverified swimmers will be scratched from the meet after that deadline. There will be no refunds for unverified swimmers scratched from the meet. Exceptions may be granted by Entry Chair when negotiated in advance. All swimmers must be verified as registered by the start of warmups, the first session.</li> <li>All adult athletes must hold current Athlete Protection Training certification.</li> <li>Age on the first day of the meet will determine age for the entire meet.</li> </ul>
<b>Disability Swimmers:</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Entry Procedures: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Enter the USA-S swimmers with a disability electronically with your team entries.</li> <li>Email the Meet Accommodation / Modification Form included in this meet information to the entry chair.</li> </ul> </li> <li>Preferred seeding is in the swimmer's age group entered event at the same distance with their equivalent non-conforming time to ensure seeding in the initial heats.</li> <li>See the Ohio Swimming Policy Book for Grouping descriptions (P1, P2, P3).</li> </ul>
<b>Entry Limits</b> <b>Entry Fees:</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Swimmers may swim a maximum of 3 individual events per day.</li> <li>\$8 per individual event.</li> <li>\$5 OH LSC surcharge per swimmer.</li> <li>\$12 Facility Fee per swimmer.</li> </ul>
<b>Entry Procedures:</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Deadline for receipt of entries is <b>Wednesday, June 11, 6pm.</b></li> <li><b>Entries will be accepted NO EARLIER than Tuesday, May 20 at 8am.</b></li> <li>Entries must be submitted in LCM using an electronic meet entry software (Hy-Tek/Team Unify).</li> <li>Unattached swimmers (not with a team) are encouraged to use Hytek's TM Lite for entry submission. Entries not completed through a team software are subject to a \$50/swimmer surcharge. Please include TEAM NAME in the subject.</li> <li>Please include the names of any Outreach swimmers in the email.</li> <li>Checks should be made payable to: Cincinnati Marlins, Inc.</li> <li>"No Time" (NT) entries <b>WILL NOT</b> be accepted.</li> <li>NO entry time standard.</li> <li>Marlins reserve the right to enter their swimmers regardless of time standard.</li> <li>The Meet Director reserves the right to limit entries, if necessary, to manage the timeline and number of competitors and spectators at each session.</li> </ul>
<b>Warm-up and Safety Guidelines:</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>The meet host will provide a complete schedule of warm-up procedures to include lane assignments and times, which must be adhered to by all participants. This information will be distributed in advance of the meet.</li> <li>Warm-ups will be monitored jointly by the Meet Director and Meet Referee (or their special designees).</li> <li>Except during supervised racing starts, swimmers must enter the pool feet first in a cautious manner with one hand in contact with the pool deck.</li> <li>Ohio LSC Swimming Safety Guidelines and Warn-Up Procedures will be in effect for this meet.</li> <li>No spectators allowed on deck.</li> </ul>

<b>Timer Requirements:</b>	<p>1500 swimmers: provide their own 2 timers and counter.</p> <p>Assistance from visiting teams may be required for any session(s) with chase starts using two start ends that may be needed to manage time line.</p> <p>Cincinnati Marlins will provide watches.</p> <p>If your team can NOT assist with these timing responsibilities (including teams attending by team travel), PLEASE EXPLAIN AT TIME OF ENTRY for consideration of exemption.</p>
<b>Competition Guidelines:</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• This meet will be: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ Prelims/Final meet for 11 &amp; Over events 200 meters and shorter. Events over 200 meters will seed Timed Final with fastest heats in Finals.</li> <li>○ All 10&amp;Under events Timed Finals, no events in Finals sessions.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• This meet will be contested as LCM.</li> <li>• All Morning and Finals sessions will swim 7 lanes with lane 8 reserved for warm up/down.</li> <li>• All 50's will start at the scoreboard end of the pool.</li> <li>• This meet will be pre-seeded. Deck entries will be accepted at the meet at the discretion of the Meet Director as determined 4 days before meet start.</li> <li>• Clerk of Course staging is available for ALL 8 &amp; Unders in events Saturday &amp; Sunday.</li> <li>• All events &amp; 400's and longer will be Positive Check In, swim fast to slow and may be seeded combined women &amp; men. See Schedule of Events for notes on events.</li> <li>• Positive Check-in Procedures &amp; entry limits: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ Check in will be in the entry hall and opens 15 minutes before Session warm up and closes 60 minutes before the <u>session start</u> time unless otherwise noted on the Order of Events.</li> <li>○ Swimmers not checked in will not be seeded.</li> <li>○ Entry fees for a swimmer seeded within the revised limits as posted on the meet webpage <u>and</u> not checked in are forfeited.</li> <li>○ Entry fees will be refunded for any swimmer NOT given the opportunity to swim and seeded higher than the final limit as posted on the meet webpage (attendance is not required).</li> <li>○ Any swimmer wishing to know if they have made the cut-off may check the meet page on the Marlins web site @ <a href="http://www.cincy-marlins.com">www.cincy-marlins.com</a> Wednesday before the meet or determine eligibility on arrival.</li> <li>○ <b><u>Timed Final Positive Check In Events Scratch Penalty:</u></b> Swimmers who do not appear for their races <u>after checking in</u> will forfeit their next event even if it is the next day; or if this was his/her last swim, his/her club will be fined \$25.</li> </ul> </li> </ul> <p>SCRATCH RULES for Prelim/Final Events applies:  <u>IN ALL EVENTS THE "OHIO L.S.C. SCRATCH RULES WILL APPLY"</u>. A swimmer must notify the recorders at the scratch table if they are scratching finals within 30 minutes after announcements and posting of Prelim Results.  Any swimmer qualifying for a CONSOLATION or CHAMPIONSHIP FINAL in an individual event who fails to compete in said Final without properly scratching per meet procedures, shall be barred from his/her next individual event.</p> <p>On the last day of Prelim/Final meet, failure to scratch CONSOLATION or CHAMPIONSHIP Finals per meet procedures shall result in a \$50.00 Penalty Fee per event charged against the swimmer. The penalty fee shall be billed to the club and paid to the meet Host.</p> <p>The Scratch Table is located on the Balcony, outside the Meet Office. Please clear your scratch with your coach!</p>
<b>Deck Entries</b>	<p>Deck entries MAY be accepted at this meet for athletes already entered and verified by the published deadline in this meet information. Deck entries will be entered in empty lanes only, entry time standard applies.</p>

At no time should swimmers congregate in the locker rooms/restrooms.</li> <li>• Adults ages 18 and Over must use restrooms located in the Jim Brower Hallway - athletes/children ages 17 and Under are not permitted to use the Jim Brower Hallway restrooms. Adults ages 18 and Over are not permitted to use not locker rooms/restrooms designated for athletes/children ages 17 and Under.</li> <li>• A family restroom is in the hallway between the main entry and pool deck.</li> </ul>
Team Areas / Facility Policy	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• It is expected that swimmers will conduct themselves in an appropriate manner that is respectful of the venue and represent their club ad USA-Swimming in a positive light. All coaches are asked to ensure their team area is cleaned up before leaving the facility.</li> <li>• It is the responsibility of parents to ensure that all minor spectators are well-behaved and under supervision at all times.</li> <li>• Any swimmer or spectator acting in an inappropriate manner will be reported to their coach and or parent for disciplinary action that may include removal from the meet and facility.
